



Bayshore Subdivision Water Upgrade Project

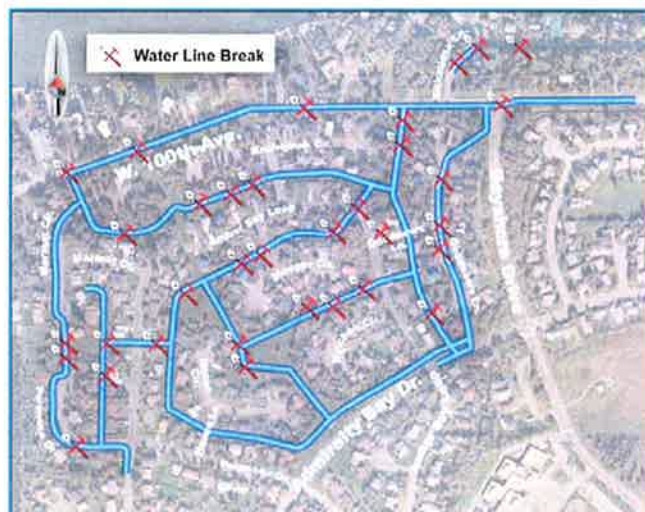
AWWU Project 11-P-02

Anchorage Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU) is proposing to upgrade AWWU water lines in the Bayshore Subdivision. Water lines in this area were primarily installed between 1961 and 1983, and there have been a high number of leaks and breaks in recent years. The project includes investigations of the system conditions to determine how to best upgrade the system to provide safe and efficient water service to the area. Field investigations will begin this summer with a design document scheduled for February 2012 and construction planned for summer 2012 and 2013.

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Frequently Asked Questions

Why does the Bayshore Subdivision need water upgrades?

Water lines in this area were primarily installed between 1961 and 1983 and there have been a high number of leaks and breaks in the system in recent years. This project includes investigations of the system conditions to determine how to best upgrade the system to provide safe and efficient water service to the area.

When will these upgrades occur?

Investigations will begin in summer 2011 with a design document scheduled for February 2012 and construction planned for summer 2012 and 2013.

What is the area that will be investigated?

The map on the previous page shows the project area affected by the water upgrade.

Who are members of the project team?

DOWL HKM will serve as the prime consultant for this project and will work with subconsultants, which include Echologics, Inc., Coffman Engineers, and Steph Engineering. Each member of the project team will carry project contact cards when performing fieldwork.

Will the project team need access to my property?

Members of the project team, including personnel from AWWU and DOWL HKM and its subconsultants, may need access to your property in order to conduct various studies. If access outside existing easements is needed, you will be contacted for approval.

When will people be in our neighborhood?

Field investigations will begin the week of August 18, 2011.

What will the fieldwork include?

Field investigations will include survey, soil investigations, and acoustic condition assessments.

What are the benefits of the Bayshore Subdivision Water upgrade project?

The primary objective of the project is to identify and recommend cost-effective upgrades to problem areas of the subdivision's water system. These upgrades may include repairs, rehabilitation, or replacement.

Will there be a cost assessed to homeowners for the water project upon its conclusion?

The project is loan funded and costs will not be assessed to customers. Customers are typically only assessed when providing water service to a new area.
